CHARLTON PARISH CHAT APR/MAY 24 - PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Annual Parish Meeting

- The Annual Parish Meeting will be on **Sat 6 Apr 24** in the Village Hall.
- Doors open at 1030 for free coffee/tea and biscuits before an 11am start.
- A key item will be on Footpaths. The Team Leader of the Charlton Footpaths Group will describe what has been achieved so far. You will be impressed!
- There will be reports from the PC Chairman and from our Wiltshire Cllr and the opportunity to ask them any questions.
- Also reports from some of the activities that go on in the village notably from the SpeedWatch team.
- Do come!

Best Kept Village Competition

- The Parish Council has agreed that the village should again enter the Wiltshire Best Kept Village competition.
- It's not a 'prettiest village' or a 'best hanging flower baskets' competition, simply looking for the best-kept village, the most cared for. The key is to leave no litter and pick up any you see. And for this reason entering the competition helps to keep the village a nice place to live for all of us.
- Reminder 2 years ago we won the North Wilts Small Villages section, while in 2018 we
 won at county level and the following year we won the 'Winner of Winners' competition
 between all the different village size winners of the previous 2 years.
- Last year we were let down by the bus shelter which somehow managed to escape attention on the clean-up day. It didn't escape the judges' attention!
- Judging will take place on one day in the period mid-May to mid-June.
- Village Clean-up the plan is to do it on Sat 27 Apr, 10am to 12pm. Some refreshments will be offered at (or outside) the Village Hall at the end of the morning for those taking part in the clean-up.
- After the clean-up day, the key is to leave no litter and pick up any you see.

Defibrillator Training

- It's a couple of years since we last offered defibrillator training in the village.
- Do you know how to use it?
- It's probably time we arranged another session of training a couple of hours, probably on a Saturday morning but subject to whether a sufficient number of residents would come.
- We'll be looking for expressions of interest at the APM or indeed at any time.

Highway Improvements in the Village

 The new signage has now appeared in the centre of the village but the road painting is still awaited. We understand that it is simply the very wet weather that has caused this delay – but we will be keeping an eye on it.

Bus Shelter Repair

 A contract for the repair of the bus shelter by the Vicarage Lane junction with the B4040 has been issued as has a contract to clear much of the vegetation behind the shelter that must have contributed in a big way to the subsidence that caused the cracks in the walls.

CHARLTON RECREATIONAL CENTRE

Thankfully the hall is still being used on a near daily basis. The majority of the users are excellent at handing the hall



back in the same condition that they received it. Of particular note the CRC committee would like to extend a special thanks to the Dog Club who are extremely thorough. The cost of hiring the hall has remained the same over the last 3 years. As such the committee are considering raising the cost, more to follow, however please rest assured, it will still be one of the cheapest venues in the area and will definitely remain a good value for money!

As previously mentioned the hall is starting to show some signs of wear and tear. Over the last few months, there have been repairs to the outside wooden cladding. Work on solving the damp problem in one of the toilets is progressing. Other areas of improvement planned in the short term include some improvements to the Air conditioning units. These changes are required to make them more efficient during the (hopefully) warmer summer months!

The CRC committee would also like to extend their thanks to the local parish council who have kindly agreed to pay for the hearing loop. This is due to be fitted by the middle of March and we look forward to offering a more inclusive hall to those with hearing difficulties.

Following a successful application for an energy survey the CRC committee will be working with Groundwork UK to ensure that all areas for a greener and more efficient building are identified. This will allow the CRC to identify fund raising targets to future proof your local hall. There will be more to follow in the next Chat update.

At the time of writing, we are expecting a full hall for the Spring quiz. The committee are also looking at other events over the summer months, including a musical festival and if some of you are willing to help organise it a summer fete!

The committee would also like to welcome a new member. Angela Collins has recently arrived in the village and has kindly offered to join the committee and will look to take over as the committees treasurer in due course. With Angela's arrival, the committee would also like to pass on their sincere thanks to Frenchy Tsabet who is stepping down from the committee as well as hanging up his sickle, after many years of service. He has been an absolute stalwart and will be sorely missed! This has however thrown up an opportunity for someone to help the local community in looking after the maintenance of the playing field. More details can be found in the Chat.

Another volunteer who has had to step down is Raj Verdi who was leading on the phase 2 improvements to the children's play park. The committee would like to thank her for all her work and wish her all the best in her new ventures. Anyone who wishes to take on the role, please get in touch with a CRC committee member.

The final piece of news from the committee is that we are supporting the D-Day 80 Lamp Light of Peace. This is a Government supported initiative, which is looking to commemorate the 80th anniversary of D-Day on the 6 June this year. We are working with Kes at the Horse and Groom who is looking to support by hosting an event in the pub at which, along with many other villages and towns across the UK, there will be the lighting of a Lamp in the evening. More details will be publicised as plans mature. Current proposals include a possible Fish and Chips supper, readings on some of the events supporting the Operation and possibly having your photo in uniform.



Charlton Churchyard

It's time to remove all glass and pottery containers, Christmas wreaths or artificial flowers from the graves and memorials.

Spring is very nearly here and soon the churchyard grass will need to be cut regularly. To ensure that it is possible to mow the grass safely and with minimum inconvenience the PCC ask that all glass and pottery containers are removed from the graves, including those buried in the grass. If concealed containers are struck by the mower or scythe the resulting fragments could injure, not only, those working in the churchyard but also visitors when walking around the area.

Please also remove any remaining Christmas wreaths and artificial flowers.

We would ask that all non-compostable materials are taken away with you. Only compostable plant and flower debris should be added to the compost heap.

The PCC take their responsibility to provide a safe working environment seriously and any glass or pottery containers left on graves will be removed.

Thank you for your assistance in ensuring that our beautiful churchyard is a safe place for all to enjoy.
